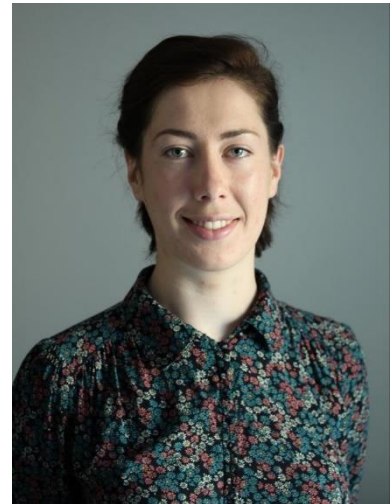
Academic Committee
